Mouse Count - K

Materials: kids, Orff instruments, a "jar", open space, <u>Mouse Count</u> by Ellen Stoll Walsh ISBN 0152002669

Objective: I can play an instrument with proper technique. I can play a pentatonic scale. I can play a glissando. I can tell a story with movement.

Process:

- 1) T reads the book, emphasizing the numbers and the action by molding a glissando on each number.
- 2) S discuss the action of the book and the characters/objects snake, 10 mice, rock, jar, etc.
- 3) T reads the book again but with students acting out the characters the snake and 10 mice. The snake can move around the room to decide what mice to put in his jar. Students not acting can play a glissando on an Orff instrument on each number (counting up means a glissando up, and counting down means a glissando down).
- **4)** Switch so that all students have the chance to act and play the instrument.
- 5) NEXT LESSON: Review the previous activity but add to it this time instead of a glissando, have the S play one note with the rhythm (one little mouse [rest]), two little mice [rest]) up each scale degree of 2 octaves of a C pentatonic scale (10 steps).
